



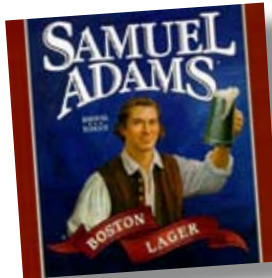
Samuel Adams

GREAT PATRIOT,
MASTER BREWER

Although his now-famous namesake brew only made its debut in 1985, Samuel Adams made a great name and reputation for himself over two centuries ago. A native of Boston, Samuel graduated from Harvard. His father made him a partner in the family malt business, and although referred to as a “brewer” by some, Adams actually never made it beyond being a “maltster.” Lacking business instincts, he eventually migrated into politics. (We are biting our tongues on that one!!!)

After a 25-year tumultuous political career in Massachusetts, he was chosen to represent the state at the First and Second Continental Congresses in Philadelphia, helping guide Congress toward adopting the Declaration of Independence (July 4, 1776) and the Articles of Confederation.

Considered “one of the foremost leaders of the American Revolution,” Adams returned to Boston and Massachusetts politics in 1781 and never again left the Bay State.



Drawing upon the tradition that Adams had been a brewer, the Boston Beer Company created Samuel Adams Boston Lager in 1985. A favorite almost instantly for its full-bodied flavor, this popular, award-winning brand became available from coast-to-coast by 1988. The Boston Brewing Company currently produces 17 different beer styles, many of which have been featured here at the Chowder House over the years and the seasons.
